## FROM THE PRESIDENT'S DESK...

The new year is well under way with many changes taking place. We recalled events and achievements in our history during the month of February. Black History is more than one month of remembrances; it should be a tribute to our history all year and a reminder of the work that lies in the months and years ahead. It is our responsibility is to continue the legacy of excellence established at John J Wright School.

CLASS REUNIONS too often take place at the funeral of a classmate or school mate. Two classes recently returned to "our dear old school" as part of their reunion. The class with the distinction of being the last graduating class of John J Wright Consolidated School (1968)celebrated 50 years remembering school days and honoring their teachers. They presented their class picture and a donation to the John J Wright Museum.

In June 2019, the class of 1959 celebrated "60 years together" culminating their activities with a banquet with their teachers as guest of honor. The class also presented a donation to the Museum. Reunions take place in the museum when former students enter and when younger generations find pictures of relatives. Older relatives are seen from a different perspective and there is the discovery of unknown stories.

An important function of The John J Wright Alumni Association is to preserve the story of John J Wright and ensure future generations will continue the legacy of excellence. Scholarships and stipends are given to qualifying high school students.

Fundraising and donations are our primary sources of income. We are a 501 (c) 3 organization so donations are deductible. We also need qualified applicants. Potential applicants and parents should begin the process by reviewing criteria when students enter high school.

We give our gratitude and appreciation to the Spotsylvania County Afro American Teachers Association aka SCAATA, for their generous donation to the Alumni Scholarship Fund. This organization of retired teachers was formed in 1987 by former John J Wright teachers. Over the years, the organization gave scholarships to a student at each high school and honored retiring teachers and staff. In retiring some of its activities, the organization shared funds with JJWAA and the JJW Museum.

#### **Spostylvania History:**

Mrs. Deborah Frazier is the first African American elected to the Spotsylania County Board of Supervisors and represents Salem District.. She is Principal of Chancellor Middle School. She has been Assistant Principal at John J Wright, Principal at Berkeley Elementary, opened Harrison Road Elementary School as principal.

Dr. Lorita Daniels was elected to the School Board representing Salem District.

#### Two new **Proclamations by the Spotsylvania School Board of Supervisors**:
